Taking over from his father, who established a transport and construction service enterprise in 1926, Murray Brockman and his brother, Donald, further expanded operations from a base within the city of Humboldt. The business has since remained in the family and continues operations to serve Humboldt and the larger region.

A long-time teacher and educator, Audrey Brockman endeavored to make a positive impact in the lives of youth. In the classroom, through volunteer associations and in church settings, Audrey is respected as a role model and mentor, inspiring individuals and generations of students to continue making a difference, long after they have left her class.

Murray and Audrey were married in 1984. They have both served Humboldt and area through their support of numerous community organizations, giving generously of their time, expertise, resources and mentorship.

Sadly, Murray Brockman passed away on December 3, 2023, and was unable to celebrate the announcement of this gift with family, friends and members of the College's learning community.

Carlton Trail College is extremely grateful that their legacy gift creates a very special scholarship fund that reflects Murray and Audrey Brockman's aspiration to encourage youth of Humboldt and area to pursue further education and training opportunities that align to their interests in the healthcare, educational and skilled trades fields.

## The Walker Wood Foundation Multi-Year Gift

The Walker Wood Foundation was established in 2006 by Neil C.W. Wood and his wife, Susan, and is dedicated to the funding of post-secondary education to students who have a high academic standing, demonstrated leadership or similar qualities, and who may have otherwise found it difficult to afford further education or training.

The inspiration for creating the Walker Wood Foundation was Neil's father, James Walker Wood, who attended medical school at the University of Aberdeen in Scotland, on an Andrew Carnegie Scholarship. James was from a humble family with little means and, if he had not won a scholarship to medical school, would not have achieved his life's goals.

Since 2015, Carlton Trail College has been fortunate to develop a relationship with the Walker Wood Foundation, with many of the College's students having been the proud recipients of Walker Wood scholarships over the years.
